# HELPING KIDS REACH HIGHER

STAR House Foundation is a non-profit organization based in Roswell, Georgia. We provide out-of-school tutoring and mentoring for at-risk children in our community's Title I schools. During 2020, we served more than 250 students attending Mimosa Elementary, Esther Jackson Elementary, Vickery Mill Elementary, Elkins Pointe Middle and Holcomb Bridge Middle Schools through our after-school programs. Unable to provide summer camp programs to our elementary students due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we expanded our community outreach to include food security initiatives. Throughout the summer months, we provided much-needed nutritional support to over 400 needy community members within our 115 participating families, ensuring that our students maintained consistent nutritional health. Working to serve the needs of the whole child provides a strong foundation that gives local kids in need the opportunity and support to shoot for the stars.






### **COVID-19 SUPPORT**

## **HUNGRY KIDS CAN'T LEARN**

With the closure of schools in March, many STAR House supporters immediately reached out to see how they could make a difference for our vulnerable population. We received financial donations as well as donations of food. We visited each of our families weekly, delivering grocery store gift cards, premade meals, snack bags, summer learning activity books, books for pleasure-reading, and more. The highlight of our summer was the delivery of graduation gifts for each of our 5th grade students. The gift bags included a collection of middle school must-haves: AVID-style binder, reusable water bottle, combination lock, scientific calculator, and cookie cake.

The move to remote learning in the spring of this year led to significant educational setbacks for nearly all STAR House students. In homes where income has to be prioritized for rent, utilities, and food, rarely is anything left for the luxury of personal computers or internet access. Remote learning led to most of our students completely losing access to their teachers from mid-March through May of this year. Fulton County Schools has now made devices and internet service available to most of our students, however many still lack home-based learning support due to their parents' language barriers and long work hours. STAR House continues to be crucial for our students' success. In September, we began offering small-group virtual tutoring to our students, with each student being assigned to two, one-hour sessions, each week. With patience, flexibility, and perseverance, our virtual programs have proven to be successful beyond our expectations.
