As STAR House celebrates 32 years of service, I am deeply humbled by the lasting impact we've made together as a community. Since our founding in 1993, STAR House has remained steadfast in its mission to empower children through academic support, mentorship, and care that extends far beyond the classroom.

Each day, we see the challenges many of our students face — economic hardship, limited access to academic support, and the need for a safe, consistent environment after school. These barriers can make it difficult for children to reach their potential. That's why STAR House exists: to bridge these gaps and ensure every child feels seen, supported, and capable of success.

Today, we proudly serve 216 students across three Title I schools in Fulton County. Our students receive tutoring, mentoring, and enrichment activities from paid professional coaches that strengthen both academic and life skills.

One of our students, Anna, came to STAR House struggling with reading comprehension and confidence. With encouragement from her tutors and peers, she grew into a strong reader and a leader—now helping younger students with their homework. Her story reflects what happens when care meets consistency.

As one of our Academic Coaches beautifully shared,

"I treasure building a relationship with each child and pouring into each one. Each success, no matter how small, is huge! I am thrilled to be working with a wonderful team."

This spirit of dedication and love defines STAR House. Our staff, volunteers, donors, and community partners are the heart of our mission—and together, we are shaping brighter futures, one child at a time.

STAR House Foundation is a non-profit organization headquartered in Roswell, Georgia. We provide after-school tutoring and mentoring for underserved children throughout North Fulton County. Our paid professional academic coaches serve children within three North Fulton schools. with a growing unmet need. Our summer camp is an extension of our after-school program, bridging the gap for elementary by focusing students on academic retention to combat summer learning loss. 
2024–2025 school year was a powerful reflection of our mission in action.



Of the 214 students served, 209 students received iReady reading assessments at least twice during the school year, allowing us to track their progress toward grade level status.

The results of those 209 students' assessments:

139 students (67%) maintained on-level competency (30 students) or showed measurable progress (109 students) in reading.





Of the 109 students who showed improvement: 76 students (70%) improved by one grade level, and 12 students (11%) improved by two grade levels.


Fall assessments showed 29 (14%) of our students were reading at "Early on Grade Level" or higher, and winter assessments saw that number increase to 74 (35%) students.





Of the 214 students served, 209 students received iReady math assessments at least twice during the school year, allowing us to track their progress toward grade level status. The results of those 209 students' assessments:

126 students (60%) maintained onlevel competency (12 students) or showed measurable progress (114 students) in math.





Of the 114 students who showed improvement: 64 students (56%) improved by one grade level, and 7 students (6%) improved by two grade levels.

Fall assessments showed 11 (5%) of our students were reading at "Early on Grade Level" or higher, and winter assessments saw that number increase to 38 (18%) students.
